**015. Corkscrew coaster, Rainbow's End, Auckland, New Zealand**

Local press in Auckland, New Zealand, have reported on an incident which occurred on a roller coaster at the city's Rainbow's End amusement park.

According to reports, a full train with 20 passengers on board stopped at the highest point of the Corkscrew coaster, apparently 30m up. The report quotes park chief executive Chris Deere as saying the reason for the stoppage was an overheating motor with the system designed to stop if the motor runs at too high a temperature.

The ride was closed pending further investigations by engineers. The attraction was installed at the park in 1986 and was manufactured by Arrow Dynamics in the US.
