TECHNICAL BULLETIN - NOVEMBER 1992

043. Code of Safe Practice, paragraph 215

This bulletin concerns a matter put to us by Systems and Safety Consultancy Ltd in relation to a new requirement incorporated into "Fairgrounds and Amusement Parks : A Code of Safe Practice". This occurs in the last sentence of paragraph 215 on page 16.

We believe that several hundred rides in the UK (including ghost trains, Alice cars, veteran cars, and other tracked rides) do not comply with this requirement. Expensive alterations might be required to satisfy the revised paragraph.

NAFLIC intend to seek clarification as to whether the new requirement is to be applied immediately to existing equipment and will also be asking for the matter to be considered at the next meeting of the JAC (Joint Advisory Committee for Health & Safety in the Fairground Industry) on 16 February 1993.

In the meantime, Appointed Persons will need to give careful consideration to whether they can provide certification for unmodified rides of this type.
